There was discussion to obligate the permit holder to provide the worker safety plan rather than each individual contractor to have their own.

There was discussion about Law Enforcement and Project Site Security. Commissioner DeMar Iverson asked if Millard County has been able to keep up with hiring police officers and whether we would need to hire more.

There was discussion about Fire Prevention, Protection & Control. There was discussion about having a fulltime fire inspector on site during construction.

There was discussion about Emergency Medical Services. Commissioner DeMar Iverson stated that there should be an onsite medical emergency station. This will lessen the response time to emergencies by not calling out Millard County volunteer medical response teams.

There was discussion about Personnel Administration, Construction Demographic Reports.

There was discussion about Landscaping, Reclamation and Roads.

There was discussion about Temporary Project Site Housing.

There was discussion about Site Drainage and Flood Control.

There was discussion about Transportation. Due to the time, Planner Adam Richins asked that the Commission revisit this topic at a later date.

There was discussion about Water, Wastewater, Air Quality and Solid Waste. Commissioner Joyce Barney asked that the applicant submit quarterly and annual reports of the water quality.

There was discussion about Rights-of-Way.
