

TRANSFER STATIONS

Millard County operates and maintains twelve public waste transfer stations throughout the county for the convenience of the citizens. All stations are equipped with 40 cubic yard, and open-top roll-off containers for disposal of household solid waste. The waste is subsequently transported to the Millard County Landfill east of Delta. Generally these sites are owned by the incorporated towns where they are located or whom they serve. These stations are located at the following sites:

DUMPSTER REGULATIONS

1. **NO** Limbs or Stumps
2. **NO** Construction Debris, including Concrete
3. **NO** Batteries
4. **NO** Dead Animals
5. **NO** Appliances
6. **NO** Dump Truck Loads
7. **NO** Overloading
8. **NO** Debris in Ash Pits - Ashes Only
9. **NO** Oil or Toxic Liquids
10. **NO** Scavenging

Millard County Landfill fees are kept low with your cooperation. Abuse of the regulations will result in increased fees and/or restrictive hours and locked gates.

The landfill crew works long hours and rarely has weekends off. They have the arduous task of cleaning up after us, the citizens of the county. Each time they pick up a dumpster at a transfer station, they gather up uncontained garbage and sweep the disposal platforms. We need to be good citizens and clean up after ourselves so they don't have to. These men also have to deal with waste in the dumpsters that should be delivered to the landfill. Large items such as appliances, furniture, tree limbs, and large volumes of yard waste should be delivered directly to the Landfill.

The county works hard to manage solid waste in the county at a minimal cost. We need the help of the citizens to keep costs down. We ask for the citizen's cooperation in complying with waste disposal recommendations and regulations.
